On May 29, 1953, Sir Edmund Hillary was the first to climb Mount Everest, 29,000 feet above sea level. When Hillary was climbing to Everest's Summit, clouds engulfed the mountain peak. The international news stated, "Edmund Hillary last seen reaching for the top."

In September, 2018, the Global Church Network hosted a "Give Me This Mountain Initiative," in Kathmandu, Nepal. More than 1,500 church planters traveled both short and long distances; some hiked for two weeks through the Himalayas in order to attend the summit. Since the launch of "Give Me This Mountain Initiative," hundreds of church planters have been trained and are now planting churches in the highest altitudes in the world. Yet, this is not enough to equip the number of church planters needed for the 20,000 plus villages that have never heard the Gospel and have never had a church located in them.

The Global Church Network in partnership with The Nepal Fellowship of Churches, are moving forward with the development and deployment of the first ever Mount Everest Training Center.

The Mount Everest Training Center will be located in Solukhumbu, Nepal, at the 8,000 ft. level.

Solukhumbu has a population of more than 110,000 people and is just 7 miles from Everest Base Camp (17,500 ft.) and 15 miles from the Mount Everest Peak (29,000 plus ft).

This state-of-the-art training center will be utilized by every major denomination and organization. It will house 330 seats, satellite technology, a world class kitchen, administration offices, men & women restrooms with showers, a lovely prayer garden, three fellowship porches and a pastor's home. In addition to training leaders during the week, the Mount Everest Training Center will serve as a phenomenal church on the weekends!

In 2007, when Dr. Davis interviewed Hillary in his Auckland, New Zealand, home, he asked, "What would it take to be focused in this season of life? After a moment of contemplation, Hillary said:

"If you only do what others have already done, you will only feel what others have already felt. If you do something that on one has ever done, then you will have a satisfaction that no one has ever felt. When one is choosing a project, if it does not cause fear, then it will become boring and you won't want to finish. When you have decided what you are going to do, don't procrastinate, start now!"

What is the Christian's Mount Everest? The Great Commission. This is the generation that can place the Cross of Christ on the roof of the world and declare Him, King of the Universe! You are invited to achieve something that has never been done before; to help carry the Gospel to the highest region in the world. Let's reach for the top together and make it harder for anyone to live anywhere in the Himalayas and not hear the Gospel of Christ!
